- To be eligible for consideration, student-athlete must:
 - Have a current Pikes Peak USBC Youth membership.
 - Currently bowl in a sanctioned youth league.
 - Be a High School senior graduating in the current academic year.
 - Have a 3.5 non-weighted GPA.
- All forms must be filled out legibly and completely.
- Completed forms must be delivered to the office or postmarked by May 1
- Nominations may be submitted two ways:

- Requirements to be submitted with the Cromwell Family Scholarship application include the following:
 - Copy of grade transcript showing at least a 3.5 GPA non-weighted.
 - Letter of recommendation from a coach, teacher, school official or employment supervisor.
 - Essay (500 – 1000 words) from the student-athlete answering the question “*How has bowling benefited you in life?*” The essay may be typed or handwritten.
- All scholarship applications that meet the above requirements, will be reviewed by the Cromwell Family Scholarship Committee, which includes three (3) PPUSBC Board Members and a Cromwell family member. They will bring the top 3 applicants to the PPUSBC Board for the final vote. Youth Board members will not be allowed to vote.
- The winner will be notified by mail and invited to attend and be recognized at the PPUSBC Annual Meeting.
- The \$500 scholarship will be given in the form of SMART money. The funds will be submitted to SMART and will be held for a maximum of eight (8) years from the date of High School Graduation and may be used for enrollment in a college, university, trade school or other accredited institution to further your education
